Welcome to the first edition of the North East Teaching Public Health Network (NETPHN) newsletter.

The overall aim of NETPHN is to begin to build a whole system approach to the development of public health education across organisations and sectors, at all skill levels and, widening the reach of public health into non-traditional settings in order to improve health inequalities in a sustainable way.

NETPHN is one of nine regional networks in England funded by the Department of Health.

The NETPHN key objectives will aim to

- increase the profile of public health across the region
- embed public health in curricula
- develop and enhance public health teaching capacity and capability
- co-ordinate the sharing of existing good practice with regard to public health teaching and learning.

MAIN AREAS OF FOCUS

Partnerships and Networking

We are working closely with a vast range of organisations, individuals, and initiatives across the North East as well as linking with the other Teaching Public Health Networks (TPHNs) at a national level along with the Department of Health, in order to share best practice.

Mapping public health related education and training

Education providers in the North East have supplied us with details of their public health related courses. This has given us a baseline assessment of what is currently available. The next phase is to work with universities and across further education to provide a more detailed picture of public health related education and training within the individual establishments. We will be working with public health workforce planners and commissioners to look at their specific needs and their perspectives as to how current public health education and training provision meets current and future needs.

Children's Workforce

The North East is the national TPHN lead for Children's Workforce. We are working collaboratively with Skills for Health and the Children's Workforce Development Council in relation to the development of 'whole children's workforce collaborations'. This is in recognition of the fact that the health and well-being of children and young people is influenced by many aspects of their lives outside of 'health'.
